



## *President's Report*

Last week we had the opportunity to present the proceeds of our Christmas raffle to the representatives of the CFA brigades from Wandin, Seville, Coldstream and Gruyere. It was a good opportunity to hear a bit about the different units and the challenges with their fund raising. The common theme was, what is supplied as "standard" issue is lacking when it comes to what is needed at the front line. Thanks Les for making the presentations.

It was decided that the Club would donate \$2,000 to help with the call for support for Fiji. The money will be channelled through RAWCS. Should anyone wish to individually contribute, all donations through RAWCS may be tax deductible. The Beer & Cider festival is progressing well. At the time of the meeting there were 19 Beer/Cider vendors and 13 Food vendors paid. This is changing almost daily. Their registration fees along with pre sales of tickets has put us in a position that the Festival will be in a position to pay all upfront costs as they occur without requesting any working capital. As a point of interest we will have more beer/cider vendors than the Ballarat Beer festival, which has been running for quite a few years. Also, we have pre sold more tickets than the recent Rochford Pork and Cider Festival.

This Wednesday (16<sup>th</sup>) at the Wandin Car show we will be handing out flyers for the Beer & Cider festival. This will be a great opportunity to further expose our event to a different group. We will need help for an hour or two from about 5.00 – 5.30. The idea is to hand the flyers to people as they come through the gate.

There will be no formal meeting on the 17th March, however Les has organised a social evening at the Chinese Restaurant in Wandin. Please let Les know by Wednesday evening if you and your partner will be attending.


