



The Board has already acted on a recommendation from the International Committee to

donate

\$US 1000 (\$1 350) to Polio Plus. We have been successful in being one of the first ten District Clubs to do so and so after matching District and RI Grants and support from the Bill Gates Foundation our contribution becomes \$US 7 500 I believe.

Next week we meet to receive feedback from the Committee Meetings. I hope that members will assist in evaluating the suggestions and perhaps suggest additions for consideration. I personally believe we could consider a 'once only' function like the 'Magic Night' – a fellowship night that makes some money – and I am keen to hear members opinion or suggestions

CIRE Community School Visit

On Monday June 26th, Pat Cullen, Brian Hodgson, Gavan McIntyre and I visited the CIRE Community School at the Yarra Junction campus to meet with the students we are sponsoring, together with Principal Tim Knowles and some of his staff. We had a good exchange of information, us telling them about Rotary and us learning about their activities, before breaking into small groups to hold our first mentoring session. Unfortunately, one of the four students we are sponsoring was unavailable on the day.

We have identified some follow up activities. One will be a session where we will address a group of year 11/12 students about the careers of a number of Rotarians that they hopefully will find of interest. The second is a vocational project: they plan to raise funds and construct a swing set and would like help planning and implementing this project. We should easily be able to help them. We await the comments from the school about the usefulness of the mentoring discussions before deciding next steps in this area.

We had an enjoyable meeting last week, Good food and good wine

- It was proposed to present two young Australia Day awards to school age children.
- Students that are awarded Junior Citizen Awards in our local schools at the end of 2017 school year will be invited to our breakfast to be re-presented with their awards in front of the local community.
- We have our keynote speaker organised, Its Anthony McAleer from Mt Evelyn RSL.
- We plan to incorporate two of the winners from Tony Smiths competition in which students were asked to write Anzac Day stories.
- We plan to run another major battery collection.
- Continue with firewood deliveries to the needy.
- We have contacted Programme with a speaker, Councillor Tony Stevenson.
- We will support Anzac Day and Remembrance day ceremonies but will let others run these events.
- We plan to give ongoing support to Mont Delancey.
- Continue with Adopt- A-Highway.
- We will organise a fellowship event. This is a car rally that Ray and Pauline Barrett have offered to organise, This will be Feb-March.
- Dennis has come to us with a great idea to run an event where we would present local leaders in business, sport or community with awards. This would be done at a special night in the Hall probably May-June next year. We think that this project might be a joint project with Mark's Vocational Committee. A lot to think about but sounds good.

At this stage we don't plan to run any wood, Christmas or Easter raffles. As far as budget goes we should make about \$4 000.00 from Australia Day, This should cover the costs of our other events.

It was resolved that:

1: We support the Rotary Club of Lilydale's "Audiology" project wherever possible. Brian to assist with applications for matching grants is requested. Cliff to be our committee representative for this project. For Budget purposes, a sum of \$2,000-00 be set aside for this project if request for financial support is made from Lilydale Rotary, otherwise our support is to be purely "In Kind".

2: We recommend to the Board that a donation of \$1,000-00 be made to Polio Plus ASAP.

3: It was noted that the planned Interplast project in Cagayan de Oro may be delayed because of unrest in the Philippines. While the committee does not wish to proceed with further fundraising for this cause, it was suggested that we may be able to partner with another Rotary Club to best utilize the \$20,000-00 of club funds set aside for Interplast to best advantage. Brian to investigate & advise.

4: ROMAC will continue to be supported as agreed by last years' committee but no financial funding is envisaged for budget purposes.

5: The committee will fully support any major fundraising events proposed by the club.

6: A sum of \$2000-00 be allowed for in the budget for contingencies that may arise during the year.

7: \$2000-00 to fund a clean water project be set aside for budget purposes.

Our budgeted expenditure of \$7,000-00 be put to the Board for approval.
